

TEXAS MUNICIPAL ORDINANCES DATABASE: SHORT VERSION

STATEMENT OF INTENT & DISCLAIMERS

As part of Once Fallen’s ongoing commitment to providing helpful information to Persons Forced to Register (PFR) on the public sex offense registry (“Registered Sex Offenders”), Once Fallen is attempting to catalogue existing municipal ordinances for states that allow municipal ordinances allowing residency/proximity restrictions and other sanctions including Halloween, holiday restrictions, employment and license prohibitions, and registry fees. This database was created by reviewing every municipal or county code of ordinances available on the Internet. Many communities also post ordinances on websites like Municode (<https://library.municode.com/>), American Legal Publishing Corporation (<https://codelibrary.amlegal.com/>) and eCode360 (<https://ecode360.com/>). Some have their own websites. A community is only listed in this database if the municipal or county codes have been personally reviewed.

LANGUAGE & ABBREVIATIONS: While Once Fallen hates terms like offender and predator, they are legal terms used in these code/ordinances. At times, we use “SP” for those classified as “Sexual Predators.”

ACCURACY AMID EVER-CHANGING LAWS: This chart was created with the purpose of reviewing existing municipal codes and ordinances placing restrictions on Persons Forced to Register. While the intent is research into the spread of ordinances, it is understood some people may use this to research areas in which a PFR may find housing. However, municipal/county codes can change any time, and some municipal codes recently passed may not be reflected in this report; this report was limited to available information found online. It is not intended to take the place of sound legal advice. Check municipal laws and contact local registry offices before you move to any community in Texas.

ABOUT THIS SHORTENED VERSION: This version contains only the ordinances that we have found, and so we did not include cities without any ordinances or those that only had employment bans. OnceFallen and members of Texas Voices have helped create and verify the accuracy of the info. Still, new laws can pass at any time to create new restrictions or expand/modify existing restrictions at any time.

SUMMARY OF TEXAS LAW ALLOWING MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE TARGETING REGISTERED PERSONS

There is not a statewide residency or proximity/anti-loitering restriction law in Texas except under the following circumstances:

- A Registered Person (RP) may not reside on the campus of a public or private institution of higher education unless the RP is assigned a low risk based on an assessment conducted using the screening tool developed or selected under TCCP §62.007; & the institution approves the person to reside on the institution's campus. (Texas Code of Criminal Procedure §62.064)
- Texas community supervision & parole laws, as well as city ordinances (allowed by TX Local Gov't Code §341.906), allows the establishment of "child safety zone." A "child safety zone" prohibits certain individuals from going in, on, or within a specified distance (maximum 1000 feet) of a premise where children commonly gather (i.e. school, day-care facility, playground, public or private youth center, public swimming pool, video arcade, or other facility that regularly holds events primarily for children. The term does not include a church). A violation of the "child safety zone" can result in the revocation of the RP's probation or parole, or a citation.

However, the state has allowed municipalities to create their own laws restricting living quarters and activities by Persons Forced to Register, though some exemptions to the ordinances can be passed.

For "Home Rule" cities, i.e., cities with populations above 5000 residents, there is no specific law that dictates whether or not municipalities can pass restrictions on Registered Persons. Home rule cities cite the Texas Constitution, Article XI, Sec. 5, which grants home rule cities broad powers to govern themselves, including the authority to adopt and enforce their own ordinances. Chapter 51 of the Local Government Code, titled "General Powers of Home-Rule Municipalities," outlines many of the specific powers and procedures related to home rule cities. So, while the Texas Constitution (Article XI, Sec. 5) provides the foundational right, the Texas Local Government Code Chapter 51 provides the statutory framework and details for home rule cities to impose their own ordinances.

In 2017, Texas passed a law allowing "general-law municipalities" (i.e., municipalities with a population of under 5000 people) to pass local residency & proximity restrictions of UP TO 1000 feet ("in, on, or within a specified distance"). "Child safety zone" means premises where children commonly gather. The term includes a school, day-care facility, playground, public or private youth center, public swimming pool, video arcade, or other facility that regularly holds events primarily for children. The term does not include a church. (See Texas Local Government Code §341.906 (Acts 2017, 85th Leg., R.S., Ch. 997 (H.B. 1111), Sec. 3, eff. 9/1/2017)). Some general-law municipalities which had passed ordinances before the passage of HB 1111 cited the following statutes within the Texas Local Government Code:

Section 51.001: States that a municipality has the power to adopt and enforce ordinances necessary to perform its corporate functions.

Section 51.012: Grants the power to adopt ordinances to promote health and enforce quarantine regulations.

Section 51.071: Authorizes ordinances to provide for the general welfare of the municipality.

As of the completion of this report, unincorporated areas are not allowed to make restrictive ordinances. Past attempts to allow counties to make restrictive ordinances have failed.

HOW TO READ THIS REPORT

There are 1,225 municipalities and 254 counties in Texas. Some of the ordinances may not align with Texas Local Government Code § 341.906; however, I posted the local ordinances as it appeared online at the time I reviewed the laws. There are always some exceptions to the rules. To see if you qualify for an exception to an ordinance, consult local authorities or review the ordinances. The chart will offer the following info:

- **City:** Name of municipality
- **Co.:** County where municipality is located
- **Pop.:** The population of the community per the 2020 US Census
- **RRs:** Residency Restrictions. Number is distance in feet; if there are no restrictions, the segment will say “No”. If an ordinance cannot be located and thus unable to be confirmed in this report, a Question Mark (“?”) will be placed here.
- **PRs:** Presence Restrictions; if a restriction exists, it will be given the following designations: OP (on premises); PB (Park Ban), PW (“public way”) A (Anti-Loitering), or B (complete presence ban, generally assumed when the PR ordinance includes the expression “ cannot go in, on, or within”), with distance of restriction zone listed in feet; if there are no restrictions, the segment will say “No”
- **HW:** Halloween Restriction Laws.
- **App2:** Who the ordinance applies to; in some cases, ordinances apply only to those labeled SVP or to offenses against those under a certain age. There are generally additional exceptions to the restrictions; please see the municipal code for details.
- **1st Pass:** This is the earliest date of passage of the law, if mentioned in the code; the current law may not have been the original law. This may be useful to those studying the spread of these municipal laws, or to those considering an ex post facto challenge.
- **Ord:** The number of the original ordinance, if known. Subsequent changes to the law are not mentioned here but may be mentioned in the next section.
- **Code:** The place in the municipal code where the most current municipal codes/ordinances can be found as of the date of the publication. Occasionally, municipal codes can be rewritten and hence the numbers can change.
- **Prohibited areas; additional notes:** The list of prohibited areas and any additional points of interest in the municipal code, such as employment restrictions, work permit bans, or registry fees. Additional notes include: work, employment, or license prohibitions and anti-clustering laws. Some only apply a few years after conviction OR release for jail/prison/supervision date, whichever comes later. For those ordinances with a set time frame on the prohibition, the years are shown in the additional notes.

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE MAPS: Many municipal ordinances require a local agency create and make available a map of restricted areas. This will usually be held at the city/village hall or at the local police station. Accessing available maps may help a Registered Person locate available housing in that community.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

This is a list of terms used in this report and/or in the statutes/ordinances listed in this report. As much as possible, we have used the legal definitions whenever available; the state statutes include section number and the definition as defined by the state statute. (Example: An ordinance may say something like “Youth Center as defined by the Texas Health & Safety Code §481.134,” rather than spell it all out for the reader.) However, while most municipal codes & ordinances refer to state statutes in their definitions, some statutes may offer their own definitions of terms that may differ slightly from the definition listed below. Please read the statutes/ordinances yourself, for further details.

- **§:** This symbol that looks like two interlocked S letters is known as the “section symbol”; it is thus used in legal circles as shorthand for a section; two §§ symbols together generally means “subsection”
- **Adjacent:** “Next to”; in terms of residency and/or proximity laws, it means property adjacent to a prohibited area.
- **Agency Foster Home** (Human Resources Code §42.002): A facility that provides care for not more than six children for 24 hours a day, is used only by a licensed child-placing agency or continuum-of-care residential operation, and meets department standards.
- **Anti-Clustering Law:** A law that states that a Registered Person either cannot reside in a building or live within a certain distance of another Registered Person. This is often used to target properties renting to multiple Registrants.
- **Anti-Loitering:** For purposes of this report, anti-loitering means laws preventing Registrants from being in a location without a “legitimate purpose” for being there. It is not a complete ban on being present in a certain area.
- **Child:** See “Minor.” However, some ordinances use the term to denote offenses against those under a certain age yet separate for an offense against a minor, and child is used as the lower age between the two.
- **Child Safety Zone (CSZ):** As defined in LOC GOVT § 341.906, “Premises where children commonly gather. The term includes a school, day-care facility, playground, public or private youth center, public swimming pool, video arcade facility, or other facility that regularly holds events primarily for children. The term does not include a church, as defined by Section 544.251, Insurance Code.” However, some local-level ordinances may define a CSZ in their own definitions section.
- **Child Pornography (CP):** An offense involving pictures or representations of anyone under 18 under federal law, regardless of the age of consent. Some newer ordinances may use a similar term, “Child Sexual Abuse Images” (CSAM), but most still use the term CP.
- **Child Sex Offender:** Individual who has been convicted of, or placed on deferred adjudication for, a sexual offense involving a person under a certain age, generally between 16-18 years of age
- **Church:** (TX Ins Code § 544.251) "Church" means a facility that is owned by a religious organization and is used primarily for religious services. "Religious organization" means a church, synagogue, or other organization or association organized primarily for religious purposes.
- **CPS:** Child Protective Services, a division of the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS)
- **Child-Care Facility** (Human Resources Code §42.002): A facility licensed, certified, or registered by the department to provide assessment, care, training, education, custody, treatment, or supervision for a child who is not related by blood, marriage, or adoption to the owner or operator of the facility, for all or part of the 24-hour day, whether or not the facility is operated for profit or charges for the services it offers.
- **Cottage Family Home** (Human Resources Code §42.002): A family residential setting with one or more homes operating under the license of a cottage home operation and in which: (A) each home has at least one houseparent who lives at the home while children are in care; and (B) based on the size of the home and the children's needs, each home cares for not more than six children.

- **Day-Care Center** (Human Resources Code §42.002): A child-care facility that provides care at a location other than the residence of the director, owner, or operator of the child-care facility for seven or more children under 14 years of age for less than 24 hours a day, but at least two hours a day, three or more days a week.
- **Exceptions:** Many municipal codes contain exceptions to the ordinances. The most common exceptions to the rule include the Registered Person Being a minor or was a minor at the time of the offense, or if the Registered Person established a residence either before the ordinance passed or before an establishment that forms a “premises where children gather” is built, or in the case of PRs, having a “legitimate” reason to be in the prohibited area. I cannot possible cover every exception in this report; please consult the municipal code for details on exemptions.
- **Family Home** (Human Resources Code §42.002): A home that provides regular care in the caretaker's own residence for not more than six children under 14 years of age, excluding children who are related to the caretaker, and that provides care after school hours for not more than six additional elementary school children, but the total number of children, including children who are related to the caretaker, does not exceed 12 at any given time. The term does not include a home that provides care exclusively for any number of children who are related to the caretaker.
- **Group Day-Care Home** (Human Resources Code §42.002): A child-care facility that provides care at the residence of the director, owner, or operator of the child-care facility for seven or more children under 14 years of age for less than 24 hours a day, but at least two hours a day, three or more days a week.
- **Habitual Sex Offender:** Generally, a person convicted of sex offenses on more than one occasion. A more specific definition used in some ordinances, reads: “any offender subject to registration under state law, who has for a ‘sexually violent offense’ been convicted two (2) or more times, received an order of deferred adjudication two (2) or more times, or been convicted and received an order of deferred adjudication or any combination thereof & is required to verify every ninety (90) days in accordance with the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, Art. 62.058.”
- **Halloween/Holiday Restriction:** Some communities prevent Registered Persons from participating in certain activities at Halloween or child-focused holidays. These can include bans on wearing costumes or masks, decorating for Halloween, passing out candy, keep porch lights on during Trick or Treat hours, and/or going to/participating in certain events. It may even include posting a notice on your lawn.
- **Itinerant Merchant:** Any person without a permanent business establishment within the city who engages in a temporary business of selling, offering for sale, renting or offering for rent any goods or services from a permanent, established structure.
- **Loitering:** Remaining in a public or private place for no apparent purpose, or with no lawful business. This is less restrictive than a full ban on being present in a prohibited area. Note: not every municipality makes laws specifically outlawing loitering as a Registered Person, but there may be anti-loitering ordinances that apply to everyone.
- **Minor:** In state law, for purposes of determining sex offenses against a minor, the age cited is 17; however, local ordinances can vary between ages 16 through 18. This generally includes child pornography-related offenses regardless of age. However, it must be noted that some municipalities use “child” and “Minor” when setting different ages for restrictions, with “Minor” being the higher age.
- **On Premises (OP):** Being physically present on the property of a particular location. “Premises” means the tract of land, and include all improved and unimproved areas on the lot where a day care center, public park, public playground, residence, school, swimming pool, or video arcade facility is located

- **Park Ban (PB):** Used in this report to denote that Registered Persons are not allowed to enter a park. There may be exceptions in some municipalities that allow entrance into a park if no minors or present or the RP is the parent of a minor in the park but not all municipalities have these exceptions.
- **Presence Restriction (PRs):** An ordinance specifically preventing entry into or loitering into a child safety zone or prohibited area. All locations listed in a presence restriction ordinance will, at the least, have “on premises” restrictions, banning entry from being on the property of that location. A distance restriction may either be anti-loitering laws (allowing for some legitimate purpose for being in a restricted area) or a complete ban on entry into the area.
- **Residency Restrictions (RRs):** An ordinance specifically preventing setting up a permanent or temporary residence within a child safety zone or prohibited area. Each municipal ordinance has its own definition of residence.
- **Premises Where Children Commonly Gather” (PWCCG):** A list of locations that are off limits for Registered Persons to enter, be present at, loiter, or reside in or near. TX Local Gov’t Code §341.906 includes such locations as schools, day-care facilities, playgrounds, public or private youth centers, public swimming pools, video arcade facilities, or other facilities that regularly holds events primarily for children. However, the list is not exhaustive and many ordinances will add the statement, “including, but not limited to…” meaning more places can be added at a later time or may be arbitrarily decided upon after the move has been made.
- **Public Way (PW):** A passageway, like a street, road, or alley that is open to the public and intended for travel. For purposes of restrictions, this means the entrance or path that leads to a prohibited location; in some ordinances, it may apply to the following places: streets, shopping centers, parking lots, transportation facilities, restaurants, shops and similar areas that are open to the use of the public.
- **Playground (HEALTH & SAFETY §481.134):** Any outdoor facility that is not on the premises of a school and that: (A) is intended for recreation; (B) is open to the public; and (C) contains three or more play stations intended for the recreation of children, such as slides, swing sets, and teeterboards.
- **Registered Person (RP, aka Registrant):** A Person Forced to Register (PFR) for inclusion on a public sex offense registry. Anti-Registry activists prefer not to use the term “sex offender” as it implies RPs are actively seeking to harm children in a sexual manner.
- **Regular Care (Human Resources Code §42.002):** care that is provided at least: (A) four hours a day, three or more days a week, for three or more consecutive weeks; or (B) four hours a day for 40 or more days in a period of 12 months.
- **Residential Child-Care Facility (Human Resources Code §42.002):** A facility licensed or certified by the department that operates for all of the 24-hour day. The term includes general residential operations, child-placing agencies, specialized child-care homes, cottage home operations, continuum-of-care residential operations, and agency foster homes.
- **Semi-Private Swimming Pool:** Generally means a “constructed pool which is used, or intended to be used, as a swimming pool in conjunction with a neighborhood recreational facility.
- **Sexually Violent Predator (SVP):** Under Texas law, the term “sexually violent predator” means a person who is has been convicted of two or more sexually violent offenses, and who suffers from a behavioral abnormality that makes the person likely to engage in a predatory act of sexual violence. Generally, those given SVP status have been or at least eligible for “civil commitment.”
- **Short Term Rental/Housing:** This term generally means the renting of a room or house for periods of less than 30 days (such as an AirBnB or Vrbo rental); The term usually does not include: (1) A bed and breakfast; (2) A motel, limited service hotel, full-service hotel, or residence hotel; (3) A boarding house; or (4)A place for residence or use as a licensed health care or assisted living facility; however, a few municipal codes may add some or all of these to their definition of short-term rentals.

- **Temporary Residence:** Typically defined as a place where a person abides, lodges, or resides for a set period days in the aggregate (a total number of days) during any calendar year and which is not the person's permanent address, or place where the person routinely abides, lodges, or resides for a certain number of consecutive or nonconsecutive days in any month or year and which is not the person's permanent residence. This will be defined in each municipal code.
- **Video Arcade Facility** (HEALTH & SAFETY §481.134): Any facility that: (A) is open to the public, including persons who are 17 years of age or younger; (B) is intended primarily for the use of pinball or video machines; and (C) contains at least three pinball or video machines.
- **Youth Center** (HEALTH & SAFETY §481.134): Any recreational facility or gymnasium that: (A) is intended primarily for use by persons who are 17 years of age or younger; and (B) regularly provides athletic, civic, or cultural activities.

RESEARCHING AND READING MUNICIPAL ORDINANCES

Many municipalities post ordinances online. Most ordinances follow a specific template. You can perform an Internet search on “(name of town) Municipal Code.” Many communities also post ordinances on websites like Municode (<https://library.municode.com/>), American Legal Publishing Corporation (<https://codelibrary.amlegal.com/>) and General Code/eCode360 (<https://ecode360.com/> or <https://www.generalcode.com/>). Some have their own websites. A community is only listed in the database below if the municipal codes have been reviewed.

Once you find a copy of the code, you may use the search function and type in the word “sex offender”, “sex” “offense” “sexual” “school” or even “feet” to try to locate an ordinance. If a search function is not an option, most sex offense ordinances will be found under parts of the code like “Offenses” or “Public Safety” or “Zoning”. Each ordinance or code may contain the following:

1. **Statement of Intent/Purpose:** A statement filled with erroneous claims of high recidivism and/or a statement the intent of the ordinances is not to punish or be punitive. The latter statement is meant to shield the municipality from constitutional challenges.
2. **Definitions:** Watch for definitions of what constitutes a “sex offender”; in many locations, the term only applies to those with offenses against a person below a certain age or given a specific status like SVP or Habitual Offenders rather than everyone on the registry. Definitions of “Child Safety Zones” and “Premises where children commonly gather” and other definitions can vary. For example:
 - a. In Cleveland, TX, a “Childcare Facility” means a “facility providing for the supervision, care, or education of children, including a day care, Montessori school, day camp, mother's day out program, facility providing after-school care”
 - b. In Friendswood, TX , a “Childcare Facility” includes a day care, Montessori School, day camp, Mother's Day Out Program, facility providing after school care; church/ other place of worship that provides children's programs or activities, childcare, or nursery services, even if only incidental to religious worship; and public or private park facility designed and utilized for organized children's activities. Friendswood adds more prohibited areas to the term “Childcare Facility” than Cleveland.
3. **Prohibitions/Offenses:** The list of prohibited activities. You may have to refer back to definitions to know what places are actually prohibited areas. Pay close to any differences between residency and proximity restrictions; some municipalities add additional areas to proximity restrictions. Ordinances generally apply a prohibition on renters offering housing in a prohibited area.
4. **Exceptions:** There are usually some exceptions to the ordinance, generally an exclusion if your conviction was as a minor, was pardoned, and/or a “grandfather clause” that allows you to stay in a prohibited zone if you resided in the home before the ordinance took effect or a prohibited business moved in after you established residence.

You may find additional prohibitions in other area of the municipal codes. For example, prohibition on business licenses are typically not listed in the same areas of the codes as the prohibitions on residency or proximity restrictions. (They’re sometimes found under a search for “sexual assault” instead of “sex offender”.)

Finally, you can ask the local registry office if there are any municipal ordinances in place. A recent municipal ordinance may not be published or added to a municipal code for months after passage, especially in smaller communities.

SUMMARY OF KEY FINDINGS IN THIS REPORT

Out of the 1224 incorporated municipalities in the state of Texas, we were unable to find 318 municipal ordinances/codes online (26% of Texas Municipalities). Only two “Home Rule” municipalities (Donna & Hidalgo, both in Hidalgo Co.) did not have municipal ordinances posted online; this report covers 99.4% of Home Rule municipalities. This report also covers 553 of the 869 “General Law” municipalities (63.6%). The percentages below are based on the number of the 906 ordinances/codes that were reviewed during the course of this survey. The smaller the community, the harder it was to find complete ordinances/codes.

- Of the ten municipalities with anti-clustering ordinances:
 - Two municipalities set the distance at 500 ft.– Crowley & Saginaw
 - Four municipalities set the distance at 1000 ft.: Fulton, Ingleside, Portland, & Taft
 - Two municipalities set the distance at 1500 ft.: Aransas Pass & Vidor
 - Two municipalities state two or more RPs can’t occupy the same dwelling: Dallas & Garland
- Of the eighteen municipalities that have sign ordinances:
 - Fourteen municipalities limit the posting of signs for Halloween: Clute, Danbury, Eagle Lake, Edinburg, El Campo, Freeport, Graham, Iowa Colony, Jones Creek, Lake Jackson, Mission, Olney, Olney, Van, & Wills Point
 - Four municipalities place no time limitations on the postage of signs, thus requiring signs at all times: Bay City, Cuero, Gonzalez, & Oyster Creek. Bay City also requires a mark on the RP’s vehicle.
